The AOA assigns CME credit to four categories: 1-A, 1-B, 2-A and 2-B. In very general terms, Category 1 is typically osteopathic CME, and Category 2 is typically non-osteopathic CME. Category A usually consists of live activities, and Category B does not (with a few exceptions). View a detailed breakdown of CME activity options for each category below. If there is a cap or rule for an activity, it is noted in the "caps, rules, etc." section. The cap or rule indicates the number of credits that will be applied towards a Diplomate's AOA board certification CME requirement for the certification CME cycle.
